## GUIDELINES Manuscripts for ANATOLICA 2006, Volume 32

### LAST CALL

Those who wish to send in their manuscripts on the history or prehistory of Anatolia or limitrophe regions for ANATOLICA are requested to observe the following rules.

Manuscripts (in French, German or English) should be corrected by native speakers before submission. All manuscripts are subjected to the board of editors who decide about their publication. Please include a diskette (MS Word or WordPerfect), a printed text copy and good quality illustrations such as original drawings, photos or slides. The whole documentation should be send by messenger service. Nota Bene: avoid electronic dispatching of texts or pictures only, because digital photos often give bad printing results!

For the number of illustrated pages (tables included) the following ratio is given as an indication. For articles shorter than 15 pages of text (ANATOLICA print page), text page: illustrated page ratio is 7 : 3. For longer articles this is 6 : 4.

In order to harmonize the illustrations, contributors are given the following advice: when preparing the pictures, please keep in mind that these will be reduced as much as possible, though without loss of vital information. Consult former issues for ANATOLICA's page format. Furthermore, put photos together, and avoid one-photo-one-drawing-one-photo series. Avoid picture formats that can only be mounted square to the longitudinal page axis.

Deadline: 31 January 2006.

Deadline for manuscripts to be published for the following year's issue is January 31.

As a rule, the issues of ANATOLICA appear during the summer season. Each contributor receives 20 off-prints of his/her article.
