



## The kingdom of Kizzuwatna: Recent developments in research

### CALL FOR PAPERS

The Netherlands Institute for the Near East (NINO) at Leiden University is pleased to host a conference on *The kingdom of Kizzuwatna: Recent developments in research*, in March 2023. The meeting will take place from Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> to Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> of March 2023 in Leiden.

Around the turn of 14<sup>th</sup> c. BCE the Hittite kingdom incorporated the neighbor kingdom of Kizzuwatna, centered in the region of Cilicia in south-eastern Anatolia. This event had a remarkable impact on the Hittite culture, manifest in the adoption of the local gods and the importation of textual lore, particularly rituals and cults. Presumably connected with these phenomena is also the introduction of the Hurrian language in central Anatolia. The history of Cilicia in the second millennium BCE, and of the local kingdom of Kizzuwatna, are thus topics of much interest in research on Hittite Anatolia. Yet, the local political history, and its socio-linguistic and cultural layout, remain quite obscure.

NINO invites scholars to submit papers on any topic relevant for the conference theme. The conference goal is to provide a venue for original research and recent discoveries, and within a multidisciplinary perspective. Thus, we will consider papers on archaeology and material culture of the region, texts and philology, religion and ritual, historical geography, social and political history, historical linguistics.

Selected papers will be considered for publication in a proceedings volume.
